United States Marshals Museum Hosts Spring Break Day Camps
Programs for Elementary School Children to Focus on Work of U.S. Marshals

FORT SMITH, Ark. (Feb. 5, 2019) – Investigating a crime scene, analyzing scene evidence, and trying to determine who the perpetrator is are just a few of the activities awaiting children at the United States Marshals Museum this spring break. Held from March 19 through March 21, the Museum's camps are for children in grades one through six.

Students will learn about detective work as well as problem solve how to break into a box of loot. They will conduct experiments in mathematics, puzzle solving, reasoning, and cooperation.

"We're excited to offer this interactive, hands-on learning experience that will help build skills and spark imagination," Director of Education Leslie Higgins said. "The United States Marshals Museum is dedicated to lifelong learning and hopes students walk away from these camps inspired by the work the Marshals do, and what they have done."

Registration is required for the day camps, which will be held at the Riverfront Pavilion at 100 N B Street in Fort Smith. Class sizes are limited; pre-payment is required to hold reservations.

This year, a grant from the William Thomas and May Pitman Hennessy Foundation is helping to reduce the cost for the Spring Break Day Camps. Tickets are \$30 for one child to attend one 9:00a-3:00p camp. A limited number of scholarships are available on a first come, first served basis.

Spring Break Day Camps will host a different age range each day as follows:

Tuesday, March 19: Grades 1 and 2

Wednesday, March 20: Grades 3 and 4

Thursday, March 21: Grades 5 and 6

Each day camp is limited to 30 students. A notebook, lunch and snacks will be provided. Pre- and post-care will be available by request. Costs are \$10 for pre-care (8:00 – 9:00 a.m.) and/or \$10 for post-care (3:00-4:00 p.m.).
