Five Civilized Tribes Sculpture Set to Arrive at United States Marshals Museum
Sculptor, Tribal Officials Will Participate in Event

FORT SMITH, Ark. (June 3, 2021) – The Five Civilized Tribes of Oklahoma Lighthouse Monument is set to arrive at the United States Marshals Museum on Friday, June 4. Designed by Oklahoma sculptor Daniel Horsechief in Sallisaw, the bronze sculpture is dedicated to the tribal law enforcement agencies that worked closely with the U.S. Marshals to capture fugitives during the frontier period. The nearly 13-foot sculpture will have a permanent home on the southwest corner of the museum’s campus. A dedication event is being planned for later this year.
